

Infrastructure or Service	Mapping Governance
Bus	The Delhi Transport Corporation (DTC) owns and maintains it. After a checkered past, the GNCT (or the Government of Delhi) took over in 1996. DTC operates an extensive network of bus routes in Delhi, including some that go to neighbouring cities. The Delhi Integrated Multi-Model Transit System (DIMTS) also operates bus routes in Delhi and works with DTC on some routes.
Bus Shelter	Ad agencies install digital displays/hoardings at the bus shelters, and there are bus shelters owned and upgraded by DTC and private companies like JCDecaux.
Street light	Provide lighting near the bus shelter, which is maintained, repaired, and monitored by the Public Works Department (PWD), Govt. of NCT of Delhi (GNCT).
CCTV Camera	Public Spaces are surveilled and remotely monitored by the Police or the PWD.
Pavement/Footpath	Installed by the PWD and in some areas designed by the Delhi Urban Art Commission (DUAC)
Green areas alongside pavements and under flyovers	Maintained by the PWD or the Delhi Development Authority (DDA). The Delhi Parks and Gardens Society (DPGS) coordinates the management of the city's parks and gardens.

Street	The Government of Delhi's Public Works Department (PWD) maintains the streets in Delhi. Currently, PWD maintains the roads above 60 feet while MCD handles sanitation, including lifting garbage and sweeping.
Sewage lines	The Delhi Jal Board (DJB) is responsible for the production and distribution of drinking water as also for the collection, treatment and disposal of domestic sewage
Land	Owned by the DDA
Public toilet	The MCD is responsible for maintaining public toilets in Delhi, including building new toilet blocks and renovating older ones. Private agencies maintain some public toilets that the MCD outsources to, such as the South Delhi Municipal Corporation (SDMC), which uses a Public Private Partnership Scheme to maintain toilet blocks.
EV Station	A partnership between BSES Yamuna Power Limited (BYPL) X GNCT
